

SUBTITLE: WHERE CINEMA SPEAKS ONE LANGUAGE

Together with our partner Spotlight, November 19th 2018 sees the return of Ireland's only film festival of popular subtitled European films — and a fantastic lineup of film-makers and stars celebrated on Sunday night at the Angela Awards, hosted by Pauline McLynn and the Camembert Quartet.

Subtitle brings together a selection of European film that invites you to see cinema in a whole new way. Most of the films at the 2018 festival have never been screened theatrically in Ireland and 14 of them are Irish premieres.

The most talked about film last year were the two preview screenings of the Finnish epic, *Unknown Soldier*. Aku Louhimies's extraordinary picture has grossed over €15 million in Finland and we are delighted to have an opportunity to present it again in this edition. Other highlights include Stéphane Brizé's electric film, *At War*, Pierre Salvatori's screwball comedy, *The Trouble With You*; and compelling debuts from Danila Kozlovsky (*Coach*) and Eva Trobisch (*All Good*).

For our 2018 edition, we are presenting 22 films. Drama, Thrillers and comedies from France, Germany, Russia, Belgium, Finland, Spain, Portugal, Italy, Sweden, Romania and Switzerland.

We are also delighted to present our strand, MAD ABOUT MELIKYAN (subtitlefest.com/mam), which celebrates the work of the Armenian-Russian director, Anna Melikyan. Anna will be in Kilkenny to present three of her films: Mermaid (Русалка), Star (Звезда) and About Love (Про Любовь).

The lives of AIDS activists in early 90s Paris are reimagined in bold and vivid detail in 120 BPM, a stunning and heartwrenching drama from the writer of Palme d'Or winner The Class, Robin Campillo. Winner of the Grand Prix at Cannes 2017 and a host of international awards, this is an essential work of cinema with a profoundly moving and delicately crafted love story at its heart. As the AIDS epidemic tears through their community, the members of ACT UP Paris are fighting for survival. While they battle against governmental apathy, pharmaceutical greed and public ignorance, they also go out partying, debate politics and, occasionally, fall in love. One day, as outspoken radical Sean (Nahuel Pérez Biscayart) strikes up a conversation with shy newcomer Nathan (Arnaud Valois), they have no idea that their lives are about to change forever. Urgent and affecting, it's a film about life, death, passion, tragedy – and, above all, the will to survive.

Featuring a powerhouse performance from Aenne Schwarz, All Good is a superbly focused work revolving around a single traumatic event. It is an extremely clever and provocative film from Eva Trobisch, which skilfully charts the psychological journey of a woman who refuses to see herself as a victim even as the strain of unreleased trauma gnaws away at her everyday life. There is an intelligence and honesty in this film which elevates it far above others in its genre; and while keeping silent can have consequences, the way in which All Good unfolds as a story, subtly and deftly sidesteps the clichés. In the central role of Janne, Trobisch has created a character which we can fully relate and in Schwarz (who will be in Kilkenny to present) she has found an actress who delivers a subtle masterclass in film acting.

How can she reconcile the needs of her two-year old daughter and her dream of freedom? Pamela embarks on a journey into the unknown, breaking away from the traditions that suffocate her. "Lapin, pizza, amour". All she has are three words in French and the hope that marriage will change her and her daughter's destiny. Alone At My Wedding features a striking and beautifully judged breakout performance by Alina Serban – who will be attending this year's festival and presenting the film.

This is a forceful, timely and extremely provocative film from Stéphane Brizé which charts the human cost of a group of workers trying to keep their jobs in the face of modern capitalism. Despite heavy financial sacrifices on the part of their employees and record profits that year, the management of Perrin Industries decides to shut down a factory. The 1100 employees, led by their spokesman Laurent Amédéo, decide to fight this brutal decision, ready to do everything to save their employment. As the stakes rise, so do the problems and the harsh realities of working in the manufacturing industry in today's free-market world come into full focus. However, on returning from their last trip away in the Vosges, David is taken in for questioning by the police as part of a murder investigation. Before long, the investigation reveals that all is not what it seems behind the happy and respectable facade of David's life. Even if Noël, his best friend, and Marco, his lawyer, stand by him come what may, in his entourage doubt begins to spread and clans begin to form. In exploring the troubling power of judgement-by-intuition and the very nature of doubt, director Samuel Tilman has created a gripping film, ramping up the tension with each passing scene; and at its centre is a brilliantly judged performance from Fabrizio Rongione, who will be in Kilkenny to present.

After attempting to cover up for an associate, Manuel is left exposed and to his surprise, the Party's members seek to place the blame for the entire scandal on his shoulders alone. However, Vidal is not one to give in easily even as his life seems to be falling apart. The RedIm brilliantly examines how far a person willing to go in order to hold on to power and the film fizzes with energy and plot twists, underscored by a thrilling soundtrack from Olivier Arson. It also features some of Spain's finest acting talent, with the central role superbly played by Spain's most versatile actor, Antonio de la Torré — and Bárbara Lennie also shines. This is a story about Petar Maraš, a Belgrade criminal in his late twenties, whose one reckless move causes an avalanche of events that will greatly affect the lives of those around him. In the life of Maraš, a member of the Belgrade 'auto' mafia, things begin to make sense. He's leaving his parental home and moving in to a new apartment with his long-time girl Sofia. Everything appears to be working well with no financial problems and an easy relationship with the local police. Everything changes however, when Maraš steals the wrong car and a deadly conflict begins with a rival regional criminal outfit. Winner of the Palme d'Or at the 2017 Cannes Film Festival, Force Majeure director Ruben Östlund has created a knifesharp satire on art, culture and communication in the digital age. The Square stars Claes Bang (The Bridge), Elisabeth Moss (The Handmaid's Tale, Mad Men) and Dominic West (The Wire). Christian (Bang) is a divorced but devoted father of two, and the respected curator of a contemporary art museum in Stockholm. He's gearing up to launch their next show, 'The Square', a daring installation examining altruism and our duty to help others. However, Christian's own views on social responsibility are put to the test when he becomes the victim of a scam, forcing him to question the world around him and his place in it. Meanwhile, a shocking viral stunt cooked up by the museum's PR agency is met with public outcry, sending Christian – and the museum – into an existential crisis. With pitch-perfect performances, inventive set pieces and a cutting deadpan wit, The Square is a hilarious, unique and often surreal look at idealism and cynicism in the modern world.

With Portugal on the brink of bankruptcy, an unemployed boxer, Jorge, sees his wife leave him to back to Brazil with their son. Debt collectors are thriving and — in order to save his family — Jorge decides to offer his services to one of them, despite their unscrupulous methods of intimidation. Portuguese actor, Nuno Lopes brilliantly embodies the repressed and unexploded power of a slice of society on its knees; his determined, torn and silent but conflicted character is a key reason the material remains so captivating, he won Best Actor at the Venice Film Festival for his astonishing performance. The light of the Atlantic is beautifully photographed by cinematographer Carlos Lopes and the film is put together with great skill and sensitivity by Marco Martins.

The Trouble With You is a terrific screwball crime comedy with a sparkling central performance from former French Shooting Star, Adèle Aenelle. Yvonne is a police detective in a town on the French Riviera and the young widow of police chief Santi, a local hero. One day, she learns that her husband — killed in the line of duty two years ago — was in fact a crooked cop. Shocked by her discovery, she is determined to right all the wrongs he committed, which eventually leads her to an innocent young man, Antoine, who was unjustly imprisoned by Santi for 8 long years. Their encounter leads to a troublesome but very funny series of misadventures, wild mishaps and bizarre accidents, all of which combine to deliver a romantic comedy of unique quality. Directed with real flair by Pierre Salvadori, the acting is top class across the board, including an excellent cameo from Audrey Tautou.

The film is based on a best-selling book by Väinö Linna, who wrote about his personal experiences in the war and it follows a platoon of ordinary Finnish soldiers in the battlefield between Finland and the Soviet Union during World War 2. From the cinematography to the use of images and wonderful performances from the actors, you are simply spellbound by the level of artistry at play in the hands of a master film-maker. Director Aku Louhimies and actor Joonas Saartamo will be in Kilkenny to present the film.



MADABOUT MELIKYAN

Born in Baku and growing up in Armenia, **Anna Melikyan** (Анна Меликян) is a writer, director and producer. She moved to Moscow to attend film school and she graduated from the Russian State University of Cinematography at VKIG in 2002; her student short films Adante, Let's Fly, Poste Restante and Double Bass won prizes at more than 40 international festivals and have been acquired by film museums in both Rome and Melbourne.

She directed her first feature film in 2004 called Mars (Mapc) which premiered at the Berlin Film Festival; however it was her follow-up film, Mermaid (Русалка) which won her widespread acclaim, landing her Best Director at the Sundance Film Festival in 2007 and propelling her into Variety's Top 10 Directors to Watch. The film was nominated for Best Foreign Film at the Academy Awards.

Drawing cleverly on the myth of Cinderella, her 2014 film, *Star* (Звезда) is a sharp and funny antifairy-tale story, which won her Best Director at Kinotavr; and two years later, she won Best Film at both the Russian Golden Eagle Awards and the Sochi Film Festival for her relationship comedy, *About Love* (Про Любовь).

She produced and part-directed the follow up *About Love* 2 (Про Любовь 2) in 2017 and is currently in post-production with her latest film, *Fairy*.

As Variety has noted, Melikyan possesses an astonishing combination of creative ingenuity and technical expertise, but it's her ability to tell universal stories with a remarkable playfulness that marks her out as a true original. She also works brilliantly with actors and very often moulds her stories around talent that she admires. It seems entirely fitting then that we celebrate her career to date at Subtitle and look forward to welcoming her to Kilkenny.


