His world turns upside down when the carefree Irakli arrives and becomes both his strongest rival and desire. This film, premiering at this year's Cannes Film Festival, has taken a number of festivals by storm, winning the Grand Jury Prize at the Odessa Film Festival and it features a uperb, breakout performance from Georgian actor Lev Gelbakhiani. The 1100 employees, led by their spokesman Laurent Amédéo, decide to fight this brutal decision, ready to do everything to save keep their employment. As the stakes rise, so do the problems and the harsh realities of working in the manufacturing industry in today's freemarket world come into full focus. Entered as Best Foreign Film, 2020 Academy Awards One night, commitment-phobic party animal, Aurora, meets Darian at a hot-dog stand in Finnish Lapland. Darian - Iranian - needs to marry a Finnish woman to gain asylum; and while Aurora dismisses his propositions of marriage, she softens with the presence of his daughter and agrees to help. As Aurora introduces numerous women to Darian, the two of them grow closer to set off a feel-good, starklycontrasted romance about two people at their ends of life, looking for a new beginning. When the perfect wife candidate comes along, Darian and Aurora are faced with a difficult choice: pretend to be happy or to finally stop running. This film poignantly addresses some big themes including the plight of asylum seekers and female alcoholism - and it is anchored by a superb central performance by

Mimosa Willamo, who will be in Kilkenny to present the film.



LA BELLE ÉPOQUE

This is a fantastic French comedy drama. Victor, a disillusioned sexagenarian, sees his life turned upside down on the day when Antoine, a brilliant entrepreneur, offers him a new kind of attraction: mixing theatrical artifices and historical reconstruction, this company offers his clients a chance to dive back into the era of their choice. Victor then choses to relive the most memorable week of his life: the one where, 40 years earlier, he met his great love. A knockout cast headed by Daniel Auteuil with Fanny Ardant and a charismatic, eye-catching performnce from Doria Tillier who will be in Kilkenny to present the film. This is the kind of picture that the French excel at — witty, laugh-out-loud




CAPERNAUM

Shortlisted, 2019 Academy Award, Best Foreign Film INT. COURTROOM. ZAIN, a 12-year-old boy, faces THE JUDGE. THE JUDGE: "Why are you suing your own parents?" ZAIN: "For giving me life." Capernaüm ('Chaos') from director Nadine Labaki, tells the story of Zain (Zain al-Rafeea), a Lebanese boy, who sues his parents for the 'crime' of giving him life. The film follows Zain as he journeys from gutsy, streetwise child to hardened 12-yearold 'adult' fleeing his negligent parents, surviving through his wits on the streets. With a remarkable 34 award wins under its belt, this is a truly outstanding film and one that

Custody won the 2019 French César Award for Best Film and is a superb picture. Antoine Besson, Miriam's divorced husband, is a nice man. In charge of security in a hospital, he is esteemed both by his superiors and his fellow colleagues. Moreover he is a good father who, willing to be closer to his eleven-year-old son Julien, has chosen to be transferred to the town where the boy lives with his mother and his older sister Joséphine, soon to be of age. That is the very reason why Antoine, the caring father, is asking for joint custody of Julien. Well, all that would be fine provided Antoine actually was the man he claims to be. The trouble is that his wife and his two children see him in a very different light. If you missed this in the cinema, make sure to catch it this time round — you won't regret it.





GIRAFFE

Preview Screening. In Giraffe, director Anna Sofia Hartmann blends real elements with a fictional story of an ethnologist (Lisa Loven Kongsli) cataloging houses for demolition, in a rural area in Denmark. Using this intimate setting, Hartmann explores a number of big themes: the role of place and belonging and how we deal with the power of memory in our lives — the present sets in motion towards the future, change hangs in the air. A young Pole, Lucek, and his colleagues prepare the future construction site. Käthe works on the ferry, steadily moving people, their stories, and goods to and fro. Birte and Leif leave their house that has been passed down for generations ... Giraffe is a poignant and complex study of manity in today's globalised world and it is a beautifully constructed and photographed film. Jakub Gierszał, who plays Lucek, will be in Kilkenny to present a special preview screening, 'The steady, unforced electricity between Loven Kongsli and Gierszał proves incredibly compelling, her simple radiance matched by his understated charisma' — Variety.



GIVE ME LIBERTY

Vic, a hapless young Russian American, drives a special needs transportation vehicle in Milwaukee. Already running late on a day when street protests have broken out, and on the verge of being fired, he reluctantly agrees to ferry his grandfather and a dozen elderly Russians to a funeral. And when he stops in a predominantly African American neighborhood to pick up Tracy, a woman with motor neurone disease, Vic's day goes from bad to worse. Inspired by experiences from his own youth, Cannes Critics' Week-acclaimed director Kirill Mikhanovsky delivers a hilarious, touching and life-affirming comedy. One of the key Russian characters is played by Darya Ekamasova (The Americans) and she will be in Kilkenny to present the film.

Shortlisted, 2019 Academy Award, Best Foreign Film Alarm dispatcher Asger Holm answers an emergency call from a kidnapped woman. When the call is suddenly disconnected, the search for the woman and her kidnapper begins. With the phone as his only tool, Asger enters a race against time to save the endangered woman. But soon he realises that he is dealing with a crime that is far bigger than he first thought. This is Danish filmmaking at its finest and director Gustav Möller understands brilliantly how to ramp up the tension and where to land the plot twists. Don't miss this last chance to see a brilliant picture that was shortlisted for an Academy Award for Best Foreign Film last year.

A HORRIBLE WOMAN

However, it doesn't take long before it turns out she is a possessive and manipulative being, who cunningly dissects the frail emotions of her boyfriend. This is the story of the woman's destructive insistence on dominance in a relationship from the man's point of view. It's a beautifully crafted film that playfully interrogates how love works and and what happens when it all breaks down. It's also a film full of insight and wit on modern relationships and it is held together by a winning, charismatic performance from Amanda Collin — come and see what all the fuss is about!



I WAS, I AM, I WILL BE

GERMANY | FRANCE | 120 MINS | 2019 | DRAMA | ROMANCE | COLOUR

This is a superb film, which won Best Screenplay at the Munich Film Festival this year. Kurdish gigolo Baran dreams of a future in Europe, while German pilot, Marion, is struggling to come to terms with a difficult medical diagnosis. When the two meet at the Turkish holiday resort of Marmaris, they engage in a kind of mutually beneficial double-cross, which rapidly evolves into something far deeper. The film cleverly charts how and why the pursuit of a better life in Europe is not so straightforward as it might be. However, while the past might be troubled and the present complicated, the hopeful promise of the future, gives this picture real bite, leading to a conclusion which is both unforced and deeply satisfying.



MY THOUGHTS ARE SILENT

In this inventive and clever Ukrainian comedy, twenty-five-

year-old Vadym earns a living recording and selling all kinds of different sounds; nevertheless, he'd rather exchange his life in Kiev for a better future in far-flung Canada. And so, when he gets a generous job offer which might help him realise his dream, he jumps at the chance; he soon sets off to record the sounds of animals indigenous to Ukraine and also a rare bird native to the Carpathians. The situation proves somewhat more complicated when Vadym's companion on the trip turns out to be his mother... To the sounds of a synthesised music score, debuting Ukrainian director Antonio Lukich skilfully unfolds a visually creative and very funny road movie. With a real understanding of tragicomedy, Lukich is a talent to watch and we are excited to present the Irish premiere in Kilkenny.



ONE LAST DEAL

An elderly art dealer Olavi, is about to retire. A man who has always put business and art before everything - even his family - cannot imagine life without work. At an auction, an old painting catches his attention. Olavi suspects it is worth much more than its starting price, which is low because its authenticity hasn't been confirmed. Olavi's instincts kick in. He decides to make one last deal in order to earn some proper pension money. To fulfil his dream, the old dealer must face both the auction house and his own past mistakes. Heikki Nousiainen gives a terrific performance as Olavi in a fascinating film which seems to suggest that sometimes the most valuable bargains we strike in life are more emotional than financial. OUR STRUGGLES

Olivier does the best he can to fight injustice at work. But from one day to the next, when his wife Laura abandons the family home, he is left alone to juggle between the children's needs, life's daily challenges and his job. Faced with these new responsibilities, he struggles to find a balance. Because Laura's not coming back. This is a superbly crafted and provocative film which skilfully approaches the nature of absence: how do you talk about desertion, without condemning the deserter? The pictures is held together by a fantastic acting ensemble with an astonishing central performance by French star, Romain Duris. He was nominated for a French César Award as Best Actor and it's not hard to see why. Do yourself a favour and get along to this one..

Entered as Best Foreign Film, 2020 Academy Awards This debut feature from Mounia Meddour is one of the few films that got tongues wagging at the Cannes Film Festival 2019 and we are thrilled to present it at Subtitle. Papicha (which means 'beautiful girl') is set during the Algerian Civil War of the 1990s, also referred to as the 'Black Decade'. It tells the story of a free-spirited, fashion-loving young student, Nedjma, whose freedom is increasingly curbed by sinister conservative forces, until there is nothing else to do but either rebel or leave — the kind of stark choice which resonates as much today as it ever did. The film fizzes with an energy and freshness that mark it out as special: one of the main reasons for this is the striking performance of Lyna Khoudri in the leading role and she will be in Kilkenny to present the film.

France, 1760. Marianne is commissioned to paint the wedding portrait of Héloïse, a young woman who has just left the convent. Because she is a reluctant bride-to-be, Marianne arrives under the guise of companionship, observing Héloïse by day and secretly painting her by firelight at night. As the two women orbit one another, intimacy and attraction grow as they share Héloïse's first moments of freedom. Héloïse's portrait soon becomes a collaborative act of and testament to their love. This is a remarkable piece of filmmaking from director Céline Sciamma — an elegant, gripping and highly charged exploration of obsession; and the key roles are enthrallingly played by French duo Adèle Haenel and Noémie



RAMS

2016 Academy Award submission, Best Foreign Film This film is one of the most requested films from prev editions, so we are screening it for a final time! In a secluded valley in Iceland, Gummi and Kiddi live side by side, tending to their sheep. Their ancestral sheep-stock is considered one of the country's best and the two brothers are repeatedly awarded for their prized rams who carry an ancient lineage. Although they share the land and a way of life, Gummi and Kiddi have not spoken to each other in four decades. When a lethal disease suddenly infects Kiddi's sheep, the entire valley comes under threat. The authorities decide to cull all the animals in the area to contain the outbreak. But Gummi and Kiddi don't give up so easily - and each brother tries to stave off the disaster in his own fashion: As the authorities close in the brothers will need to come together to save the special breed passed down for generations, and themselves, from extinction.



SYSTEM CRASHER

Entered as Best Foreign Film, 2020 Academy Awards She is small, but dangerous. Wherever Benni ends up, she is immediately expelled. The wild 9-year-old girl has already become what child protection services call a 'system crasher And she is certainly not looking to change her ways. Because Benni has one single goal: to be back at home with her mum. But Bianca is scared of her own daughter. Mrs Bafané from child protection services is trying her best to find a permanent placement for Benni. She hires the anger management trainer Micha as Benni's school escort and suddenly there is a seed of hope. Will Micha be able to succeed where all others despaired? This brilliant film will assault your senses like no other and is not to be missed. It recently won the Audience Award at the Toronto International Film Festival and Albrecht Schuch, who gives a sensitive, note-perfect performance as

She, however, is not ready for motherhood and if Erik doesn't want the kid either, the little girl will be put up for adoption. Take it or leave it! This is an extremely accomplished and touching film about the difficulties and awakening of fatherly love as a reflection on the feminine condition. Director Liina Trishkina-Vanhatalo dials up the suspense impressively and she is ably supported by a remarkably sensitive and persuasive performance from her lead actor Reimo Sagor, who will be in Kilkenny to present

Everything changes when Georg falls in love with the mysterious Marie who is desperate to find her missing husband. Based on the eponymous novel by Anna Seghers, award-winning director Christian Petzold's superbly deft drama tells the story of a nearly impossible love amid escape, exile and a longing for a place to call home — and the film won the Dublin Film Critics' Circle Award earlier this year. The key role of Marie is strikingly played by rising star, Paula Beer and she will be in Kilkenny to present the film.



THE WHISTLERS

Not everything is as it seems for Cristi, a police inspector in Bucharest who plays both sides of the law. Embarked by the beautiful Gilda on a high-stakes heist, both will have to navigate the paths of treachery and deception. A secret whistling language spoken on the Spanish island of La Gomera might just be what they need to pull it off. One of the hits at the 2019 Cannes Film Festival, this is a terrifically stylish neo-noir thriller from Romanian director Corneliu Porumboiu (12:08 East of Bucharest, Police Adjective) — full of twists and turns to keep the viewer guessing all the way to the film's conclusion; the ever impressive Vlad Ivanov who plays the leading role of Cristi will be in Kilkenny to present the film.



THE TROUBLE WITH YOU

Nominated for 9 French César Awards and back by popular demand, this is a terrific screwball crime comedy with a sparkling central performance from former French Shooting Star, Adèle Haenel. Yvonne is a police detective in a town on the French Riviera and the young widow of police chief Santi, a local hero. One day, she learns that her husband killed in the line of duty two years ago - was in fact a crooked cop. Shocked by her discovery, she is determined to right all the wrongs he committed, which eventually leads



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her to an innocent young man, Antoine, who was unjustly imprisoned by Santi for 8 long years. Their encounter leads to a troublesome but very funny series of misadventures, wild mishaps and bizarre accidents, all of which combine to deliver a romantic comedy of unique quality. Directed with real style by Pierre Salvadori, the acting is top class across the board, including an excellent cameo from Audrey



WOMAN AT WAR

Entered as Best Foreign Film, 2019 Academy Awards Halla, a woman in her forties, declares war on the local aluminum industry to prevent it from disfiguring her country. As Halla's actions grow bolder, from petty vandalism to outright industrial sabotage, she succeeds in pausing the negotiations between the Icelandic government and the corporation building a new aluminium smelter in the mountains. But right as she begins planning her biggest and boldest operation yet, she receives an unexpected letter that changes everything: her application to adopt a child has finally been accepted and there is a little girl waiting for her in Ukraine. As Halla prepares to abandor her role as saboteur and saviour of the Highlands to fulfil her dream of becoming a mother, she decides to plot one final attack to deal the aluminium industry a crippling blow Funny, topical and moving, this was one of the most talked about foreign films of 2019.



Vardis Marinakis

After his compelling drama Black Field (2010), Greek director Vardis Marinakis returns with a film borne on the back of a juvenile performance of remarkable intelligence and spontaneity.
